## September Workshop: AI in Compliance from Generative to Agentic

Mid-September, Date TBC | Washington, DC

C4I, in partnership with Steptoe LLP, a C4I Legal and Advisory Supporter, will host a full-day workshop on AI in corporate compliance, with a particular focus on autonomous and agentic systems. The workshop is designed to be practical, forward-looking, and grounded in real compliance workflows.

Programming includes moderated expert panels on AI capabilities and governance, a keynote on where AI is headed, and live technical demonstrations of agentic AI in compliance scenarios. Panel topics cover what AI agents can do in compliance today and what is coming next, practical governance frameworks for oversight and accountability, and legal risk and liability when AI informs or acts on compliance decisions.

This workshop is designed for senior compliance officers and legal professionals working at the intersection of AI deployment and corporate accountability. Full program details and registration information will be announced soon.

## Recap: June Corporate Forum on Cartels, TCOs, and Compliance

C4I convened a Corporate Forum on FCPA enforcement priorities and the growing focus on cartels and transnational criminal organizations (TCOs). The session brought together senior legal and compliance leaders for a candid,

peer-level conversation on what the shifting enforcement landscape means for multinational compliance programs.

The panel featured David Fuhr, Chief of the DOJ FCPA Unit; James Tillen, Vice Chair, International at Miller & Chevalier; and Alyssa Misner, Director at Risk Advisory Group; and was moderated by C4I Board Member Kathryn Nickerson. Discussion covered current DOJ enforcement priorities, the practical implications of the June 2025 FCPA guidelines, cartel and TCO risk assessment, and how companies are recalibrating their compliance programs in response. A lunch Q&A and Chatham House Rule roundtable discussion followed, giving participants space for direct engagement and candid peer exchange.

## C4I at the Basel Institute's 6th International Collective Action Conference

C4I participated in the Basel Institute on Governance's 6th International Collective Action Conference earlier this month. The gathering brought together practitioners and organizations working on collective action approaches to anti-corruption and business integrity from around the world.

Several themes from the conference connect directly to C4I's current work: the growing link between anti-corruption and human rights functions and the need for closer collaboration across corporate risk teams; the role of institutional values in sustaining compliance programs over time; and the expanding role of technology and AI governance in collective integrity efforts. All three are areas where C4I is actively developing programming.
